5. Disciplinary hearings pursuant to NRS 639.247. **(FOR POSSIBLE ACTION)**

E. Hilco Vision

(25-187-WH-S)

David Hufnagle (Vice President of Global QA/RA) and Jeffrey Moore, Esq. (Counsel) were present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Hilco Vision, alleging that Hilco Vision engaged in the sale and distribution of ophthalmic products that was manufactured by Omni Lens Pvt. Ltd., a manufacturer in India, which is not registered by the FDA, nor did their products conform to Current Good Manufacturing Practice (cGMP).

The proposed stipulated penalties for Hilco Vision, License No. WH02862, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$2,500 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 1, 2026.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Patricia Sanchez, alleging that Respondent Sanchez failed to disclose her criminal history on her 2023 pharmaceutical technician in training application and her 2025 pharmaceutical technician application.

Mr. Kandt requested that the declaration of service by Board staff showing that Respondent Sanchez received proper notice of the charges and of the hearing be entered into the record as Exhibit 1.

President Park entered the declaration of service by Board staff as Exhibit 1.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board make Findings of Fact consistent with paragraphs 1-3 in the Accusation.

K. Jose Escobedo

Lyn Beggs, Esq., was present on behalf of Jose Escobedo.

President Park stated that she is familiar with Jose Escobedo but that she can participate in this matter fairly and without bias.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Jose Escobedo alleging that Respondent Escobedo verified prescriptions that did not comply with Nevada law, thus causing his employer, Meta Pharmacy, to dispense dangerous drugs and controlled substances to Meta's customers without proper medical authorization.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Jose Escobedo, Certificate of Registration No. 20782, are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 20782 is revoked, however the revocation is stayed and Respondent is placed on probation for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 31, 2026; and 4) Respondent must complete four (4) continuing education credit hours on the topic of ethics in the practice of pharmacy.

C. Antonino Gumina

(24-430-CS-S)

Antonino Gumina was present.

Brett Kandt, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Antonino Gumina, alleging that Respondent Gumina failed to query the PMP prior to issuing controlled substance prescriptions, permitted unauthorized persons to use his username and password to unlawfully access the PMP Database, and failed to query and review for accuracy his MyRx prescriber activity report in the PMP database at least once every 6 months.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Antonino Gumina Certificate of Registration No. CS09380: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS09380 is placed on probation for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations, to be due and payable by June 3, 2027; 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, to be due and payable by July 31, 2026; and 4) Respondent shall complete training from Board staff on use of the PMP database within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Order, and follow-up PMP training six (6) months after the initial training.

M. Tiana Hubbard

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Tiana Hubbard, alleging that Respondent Hubbard permitted non-practitioner owners, managers, and/or employees to engage in unregistered prescribing, failed to establish and maintain effective controls against diversion of controlled substances, and failed to query the PMP database as required by Nevada Law.

Mr. Zunino called Jessette Phaynarikone as a witness.

President Park swore Ms. Phaynarikone in as a witness.

Mr. Zunino questioned Ms. Phaynarikone.

Ms. Phaynarikone answered questions and gave testimony.

Mr. Zunino requested that the Board approve the proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

The proposed order for Tiana Hubbard Certificate of Registration No. CS25791 is the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. CS25791 is revoked, effective immediately. Respondent cannot apply for reinstatement for a period of one (1) year from the effective date of the Order; 2) Respondent fined \$5,000 for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs as reasonable, necessary and actually incurred, both to be due and payable by July 31, 2026.

Mr. Zunino requested that the proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order be entered as Exhibit 1 into the record, and the memorandum of costs and fees be entered as Exhibit 2 into the record.

William Stilling, Esq. (counsel for both Respondents), and Mona Matar were present.

Laura Tucker, General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Walgreens Pharmacy #03922, alleging that, as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Walgreens #03922 is responsible for the acts of its employees who made an error in a prescription.

Ms. Tucker prosecuted the case against Mona Matar alleging that Respondent Matar made an error in a prescription.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Mona Matar, Certificate of Registration No. 20104, are the following: 1) Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 20104 is suspended; however, the suspension is stayed. Respondent is placed on probation for a period of one (1) year subject to the following conditions; 2) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 3) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of this order.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Walgreens Pharmacy #03922, License No. PH01127, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$2,000 for the violations; and 2) Respondent assessed \$1,000 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable within thirty (30) days of this order.

Jade Jacobo was excused from the meeting at 10:03 AM.

Mr. Kandt requested that the declaration of service by Board Staff showing that Respondent Steidl received proper notice of charges and of the hearing be entered into the record as Exhibit 1.

President Park entered the declaration of service by Board Staff as Exhibit 1.

Mr. Kandt requested the Board make Findings of Fact consistent with paragraphs 1-3 of the Accusation.

G. Raley's Pharmacy #123

(24-366-PH-N)

Timothy Kuhls, Esq., was present on behalf of Raley's Pharmacy #123.

Gregory Zunino, Senior General Counsel for the Nevada Board of Pharmacy, prosecuted the case against Raley's Pharmacy #123, alleging that as pharmacy/pharmacy owner, Raley's Pharmacy #123 is responsible for the acts of its employees who failed to document whether counseling was offered or provided for a dispensed prescription as required by state regulation.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Raley's Pharmacy #123, License No. PH00999, are the following: 1) Respondent fined \$750 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by July 31, 2026; and 3) Respondent agrees that it will continue to cooperate with the Board's inspectors in terms of explaining and/or demonstrating how its systems for documenting patient

counseling operates and to make reasonable changes or modifications to that system, as appropriate, to address any compliance concerns that the Board may have.

Board discussion ensued.

Adam Porath noted that the April 2026 Board Meeting minutes reflect that the other Respondent in this case was fined \$1,000 instead of the correct amount of \$750.

The failure to correct the error caused a lengthy interruption to the patient's medication therapy and resulted in a negative medical outcome to the patient.

Ms. Beggs gave her opening statement.

The proposed stipulated penalties for Camilla Kim, Certificate of Registration No. 19338, are the following: Respondent's Certificate of Registration No. 19338 is revoked, however the revocation is stayed and respondent's license is placed on probation until June 30, 2028, subject to the following conditions: 1) Respondent fined \$1,000 for the violations; 2) Respondent assessed \$1,500 in attorney's fees and costs, both to be due and payable by August 31, 2026; 3) Respondent shall participate in a professional monitoring program in accordance with the recommendations of Dr. Mark Chase and shall cause Dr. Chase, or his designee, to transmit quarterly reports to the Board's staff; and 4) Respondent agrees to appear at a meeting of the Board to answer questions concerning her progress and participation in the professional monitoring program, if requested by Board prior to the renewal of her certificate of registration in 2027.

Mr. Zunino stated that upon approval of the stipulation and order, Count Two of the first amended accusation shall be dismissed as it pertains to Respondent Kim.
